## JAD's Rolleston offering a hit

THE Dickens family's decision to hold their inaugural Queensland JAD Speckle Park and Angus bull sale at Rolleston on August 2 has been hailed a success.

Based in Yeoval, NSW, Justin and Amy Dickens and family offered 35 bulls at their first Queensland sale, selling 33 of them at the fall of the hammer.

Among the offerings, 20 out of 22 Speckle Park bulls sold for a top price of \$12,000 and averaged \$6316, while all 13 Angus bulls sold for a top price of \$18,000 and averaged \$11,692.

Shortly after the sale, the two unsold Speckle Park bulls sold, adjusting the average to \$6136.

Overall, the sale achieved a full clearance of the 35 bulls offered, resulting in a new sale average of \$8200.

The top-priced bull, JADA Tobruk T520, was a 22-month-old son of Clunie Range Plantation P392, weighing 773 kilograms.

He sold for \$18,000 and was purchased by Loretta and Murray Smith of

Amy Dickens added that it was exciting to introduce Speckle Park beef to Rolleston, with many attendees experiencing it for the first time.


"The Speckle Park beef barbecue was very well received," she said.
